## PCRWC PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

### PCRWC Members:

As most of you are aware, our state is undergoing a redistricting process that will set Congressional and Legislative district boundaries for the next 10 years. The Democrats are working hard to see that this process favors them politically. I have been attending some of these meetings held around the state for the last two months. It is imperative that the decisions be made in a fair and unbiased manner. But that has not been the case. The Redistricting Commission consists of 2 Republicans, 2 Democrats, and 1 Independent. This would appear fair enough were it not for the fact that the Independent member who is also the chairman of the Commission is very liberal and sides with the Democrats on every issue. So the decisions made are constantly made with a 3-2 vote in favor of the Democrats. It is obvious that the Democrats want as much of an advantage as possible with the mapping of the districts. The following is the address I made to the Commission at the last meeting on July 25th:

I am Marilyn Zerull representing Pima County Republican Women. I cannot tell the commissioners how disappointed I am in how they have selected the mapping company for which WE are PAYING. Commissioner Herrera admitted to BID FIXING which may not be criminal but certainly is unethical.

Commissioner Herrera admitted to the AZ Capitol times investigator that he had given Strategic Telemetry a perfect score, and COINCIDENTALLY two other commissioners gave them perfect scores as well. Herrera said he "had to" give that score because he was "afraid that another company would be chosen" I recently learned that half of the scoring was to be based on past experience with mapping, and that Strategic Telemetry had NO EXPERIENCE!! So the three commissioners chose for the LEAST experienced and the MOST expensive bid.

This is exactly what happened at another meeting that I attended where the three commissioners told the two Republican commissioners that they could NOT have the attorney they wanted, though the Democrat commissioners got the Democrat attorney they wanted. In 2000 both sides got the attorneys they wanted. So this time the Republicans chose the Republican attorney that had been through the redistricting process before and so was the MOST EXPERIENCED. But the three other commissioners told the Republicans that the attorney they wanted was LESS QUALIFIED. Even though one of the Republican commissioners IS AN ATTORNEY, one would expect him to know who was the best qualified attorney to represent him.

So the Republicans have been denied the best attorney and the most qualified, less expensive mapping company. This entire process HINGES ON TRUSTING THE COMMISSIONERS TO DO THE RIGHT THING? Hopefully, Attorney General Tom Horne will make sure the RIGHT THING gets done.

**"ON THE HILL" - THE DEBT DEAL**



*Hey Eric, just make it easy on all of us and do what I say, after all, I am the Anointed One!*

President Obama on Tuesday signed into law a months-in-the-making plan to raise the debt ceiling, putting an end for now to the partisan crisis that risked the first-ever national default. Before reaching the president's desk, the package cleared the Senate on a 74-26 vote. The deal was approved just hours before the Treasury was otherwise expected to exhaust ways to pay all the nation's bills.

Senate leaders hailed the deal as a "testament" to the work of negotiators, while conceding it is "not perfect" and certainly not the last time lawmakers would be at odds over the nation's prolific borrowing.

"This bill does not solve the problem, but it at least forces Washington to admit that it has one," Senate Republican Leader Mitch McConnell, R-Ky., said on the floor, claiming the discussion about spending "isn't something to dread."

Officials moved quickly to set the terms for the debate to come. While the package will initially cut spending by \$900 billion, it also tasks a new committee with finding another \$1.5 trillion in deficit reduction by the end of the year.

Senate Democratic Leader Harry Reid, D-Nev., said he hopes the committee takes a "fair" approach, suggesting the panel should compel wealthy Americans to pay more in taxes. "The American people demand fairness. It can't be more cuts to programs that have made this country what it is," he said. Obama echoed those comments in the Rose Garden.

After striking the deal Sunday, party leaders spent the last couple days corraling support from rank-and-file members. Despite the wide margin of approval, several senators continued to voice concerns with the bill in the run-up to the vote. Seven Democrats also opposed the bill.

The House passed the deal 269-161 in an eleventh-hour vote Monday, which also was notable for marking Rep. Gabrielle Giffords' return to Capitol Hill. The Arizona representative hadn't been in the House since January, when she was critically injured in a shooting rampage in Tucson. Giffords was met by loud applause on the House floor and voted yes.

"I had to be here for this vote. I could not take the chance that my absence could crash our economy," Giffords said in a statement.

Congress had until the end of the day Tuesday to raise the \$14.3 trillion debt ceiling in order for the Treasury to be able to continue paying all its bills. Doing nothing would risk defaulting on the nation's debt for the first time.

House Speaker John Boehner had to rely on a blend of Republicans and Democrats to push the bill through his chamber the day before, with some conservatives unhappy about key provisions in the compromise.

House Democrats didn't want to carry Republicans' water, though. While 95 Democrats voted for the bill, an equal number voted against. A total of 174 Republicans supported the bill, while 66 voted against it.

Liberal Democrats were unhappy in part because the first phase of the plan relies solely on spending cuts -- \$900 billion worth of them.

The second phase of the plan relies on a special committee to come up with roughly \$1.5 trillion in additional deficit reduction. Both sides are wary about what that process could produce, in terms of entitlement reform and tax reform.

And conservatives are particularly agitated about a provision that would enact sweeping defense cuts if the committee's recommendations are not approved by the end of the year. Plus some are peeved that, while the package would call for a vote on a balanced-budget amendment, it would not require its approval in order for the debt ceiling to be increased.

In the second phase of the plan, the debt ceiling will be raised by \$1.5 trillion if the committee recommendations are approved by the end of the year. The size of the increase could be smaller if the approved cuts are smaller.

Each of the GOP and Democratic leaders in the chambers will nominate lawmakers to the 12-member committee to report back in the fall. The vote, to take place by Dec. 23, would be an up-or-down vote with no amendments allowed.

Obama said everything will be on the table and both parties will find some of the cuts objectionable.

"Despite what some Republicans have argued, I believe that we have to ask the wealthiest Americans and biggest corporations to pay their fair share by giving up tax breaks and special deductions. Despite what some in my own party have argued, I believe that we need to make some modest adjustments to programs like Medicare to ensure that they're still around for future generations. That's why the second part of this agreement is so important," Obama said from the White House briefing room. *-From the Pima GOP website*

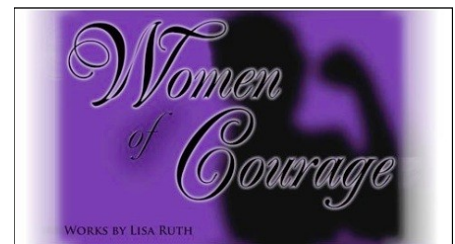

**ARIZONA REDISTRICTING PANEL BEING INVESTIGATED BY ATTORNEY GENERAL TOM HORNE**

PHOENIX - The Arizona Attorney General's office is investigating whether the state's redistricting commission violated open meeting and procurement laws.

Attorney General Tom Horne says the initial civil investigation concerns the commission's selection of Washington-based Strategic Telemetry as its mapping consultants.

Republicans have noted that Strategic Telemetry's head has done campaign work for President Barack Obama and other Democrats and questioned whether the commission's work would be impartial.

The Arizona Capitol Times last week reported that the commission had met for 37 hours in closed-door executive sessions since being formed. The newspaper also said responses to its public records requests on procurement records did not appear to be complete.

Commission Executive Director Ray Bladine said he's confident that the attorney general will conclude that the panel has adhered to state laws on open meetings and procurement.

"I need to emphasize very clearly that this is an initial investigation that will attempt to determine if any violations actually occurred," Horne said. "I am concerned about reports that have raised questions about some of the procedural actions taken by the commission, and I am committed to finding out whether those concerns warrant any further investigation. If this initial investigation finds that laws have been violated, we will proceed accordingly."
